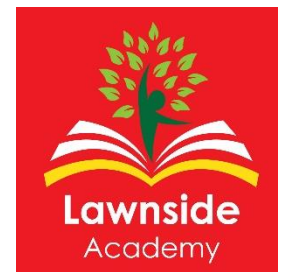


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Dear Parents/Carers,

Thank you for taking the time to look through our PSHE and RSE curriculums and providing us with some valuable feedback. Based on the responses received, all of you feel that PSHE and RSE is an important part of the curriculum.

The survey highlighted some important areas to help us improve our PSHE curriculum. Some of the areas you identified were:

- Bullying and the impact this can have
- Mental health – anxiety, panic attacks
- Self-regulation
- Smoking and the dangers
- Road safety
- Internet safety and, in particular, the awareness of people not being who they say they are
- Death, bereavement, family illnesses and the impact this can have

Some of the areas identified are currently taught in middle schools; in the upper Key Stage 2 curriculum, and will form part of our Year 5 and 6 curriculum when we convert to a primary school. I would also like to reassure you that some of the areas related to internet safety are covered in both the PSHE and computing curriculums. As a school, we also have focus weeks/days throughout the year; such as anti-bullying week, children's mental health week, internet safety and road safety week to reinforce and support the PSHE curriculum.

All of the areas highlighted by the survey will be woven into our curriculum to ensure it meets the needs of our children and the local community.
