

Lawnside Academy only has one entrance for vehicular traffic (Lawnside off Lawrence Road). This road is residential, single-width and a cul-de-sac.

There are 2 entrances to the school for pedestrians and cyclists (staff):

• Staff and visitors mostly use the main school entrance; at the end of Lawnside, off Lawrence Road.



• Pupils and parents mostly use the pedestrian entrance which is halfway along the alleyway running parallel to the school. The alleyway is accessed from Lawnside and The Baulk. The alleyway is for pedestrians only (cycles prohibited signs at each end).





The pavements are in average condition and there are dropped kerbs by the alleyways.

Lawnside, The Baulk and Drove Road have 30mph limits – there is a large amount of residential parking so traffic travels a lot slower than the speed limit. The Baulk is one-way.

There are 'school keep clear' signs at the school vehicular entrance on Lawnside and outside the Children's Centre on The Baulk.

There are two zebra crossings on London Road (close to Dells Lane and Crab Lane) and a pelican crossing on Crab Lane (past Rose Lane).

There is a school crossing patrol on Drove Road.

The Lawns Nursery & Children's Centre are run independently and accessed from The Baulk.

St Andrew's Lower school and Stratton Upper school are within a 12-minute walk from Lawnside. Ivel Valley College is adjacent to Lawnside and has its own car park accessed from The Baulk. Pupils are transported to here from all over Central Bedfordshire (mostly by minibus).



Walking access - mostly quiet residential footpaths. Access from Lawnside, Drove Road and The Baulk. **Cycle access** - some dedicated cycle routes. The Baulk and London Road have segregated cycle routes, though not suitable for pupils.

Bus access -

Service 85a is a local route and only has an evening service which could be suitable for staff.

Service 200 from the bus station to Flitwick would only be suitable for evening journeys for staff.

Service 190 from the bus station to Sandy/Potton would only be suitable for evening journeys for staff. Service 73 (Bedford) from Drove Road (Spring Close).

Review of current travel arrangements

In relation to travel at the start and end of the school day what currently works well?

For example, a high proportion of pupils walk, scoot or cycle, good parking etiquette by those collecting pupils, good compliance with waiting restrictions, School Crossing Patrol or a controlled crossing that is well used etc.

A high proportion of pupils walk, scoot or cycle.

Mostly good parking etiquette by those bringing / collecting pupils – parents are regularly reminded not to drive up Lawnside at the beginning / end of the school day (through newsletters and Parent Mail).

There is a school crossing patrol on Drove Road that is well used. There are zebra crossings on London Road (Dells Lane and Crab Lane) and a pedestrian crossing on Crab Lane (near Rose Lane).

In relation to travel at the start and end of the school day what could be improved?

For example, parking that causes congestion, parking on pavements, poor compliance with waiting restrictions, parked vehicles restricting visibility at junctions, narrow pavements, no dropped kerbs at junctions etc. How will parents be informed - newsletters/website/email.

Increasing the proportion of pupils walking, scooting or cycling to school.

Improving the parking etiquette / compliance of those who do not adhere to school request to not drive up Lawnside at the beginning / end of the school day.

Reduce occasional complaints from residents living on the Baulk re: parking that causes congestion, parking on pavements at the beginning and end of the school day.

Parents will be informed through newsletters and Parent Mail.

Aim of the School Travel Plan

Some ideas are as follows:

To understand the existing travel patterns on the journey to and from school

To increase the number of journeys to and from school using a sustainable mode of travel

To understand the safest walking and cycling routes to and from school

To increase the number of journeys to and from school using a sustainable mode of travel.

Offer staff, parents and pupils sustainable travel options.

Encourage staff, parents and pupils to walk, scoot, cycle, use public transport or car share.

Objectives of the School Travel Plan

The objectives should address the travel improvements identified. Some ideas are as follows (there should be a minimum of 5 objectives):

To reduce the number of cars parked on surrounding roads at the start and end of the school day

To increase the number of pupils walking and cycling/scooting to school

To promote the existing bus routes

To promote park and stride

To encourage car sharing

Establish a working group with school, parents, governors, representatives of the local community

To reduce the number of cars parked on surrounding roads at the start and end of the school day.

To increase the number of pupils walking and cycling/scooting to school.

Promote local bus routes.

To promote park and stride (via newsletters/ website) – parents living a distance from the school (and have no alternative than to drive) can park in Rose Lane, Asda or Chestnut Avenue car parks.



Encourage staff to car share.

Establish a working group with school, parents, governors, representatives of the local community.

How will the objectives be achieved?

Some ideas are as follows:

Consider whether additional waiting restrictions may be required

Prepare a travel information leaflet that is distributed to pupils, parents and staff – to be made available on the school's website and noticeboards

Include local bus routes and timetables in the Travel Information Leaflet and Travel Plan

Set up a park and stride scheme - investigate whether the car park could be used by parents at the start and end of the school day (permission will need to be agreed)

Encourage staff to sign up to Lift Share either between themselves or via <u>https://liftshare.com/uk/community/luton-and-central-bedfordshire</u>

Cyclescheme for staff What is the cycle to work benefit? - Cyclescheme

Set up a system to encourage parents to car share informally between themselves

Set up a Travel Plan working group (to include the school, parents, governors and representatives of the local community).

Prepare a travel information leaflet that is distributed to pupils, parents and staff – to be made available on the school's website and noticeboards.

Promote bus routes and timetables in the travel leaflet and on the school website.

Promote park and stride locations for parents/pupils that live a distance from the school and have no alternative but to drive.

Encourage staff to car share https://liftshare.com/uk/community/luton-and-central-bedfordshire

Investigate Cyclescheme for staff.

Set up a Travel Plan working group (to include the school, parents, governors and representatives of the local community). Meet termly.

Action Plan

- We ask that every school has an active School Travel Plan which is updated annually as a minimum.
- The school should appoint a named Travel Plan Coordinator who will be responsible for the overall management of the School Travel Plan and be a main point of contact at the school for any travel and transport related enquiries.
- This template has been put together to assist each school in completing their School Travel Plan. This template doesn't have to be used; it is recommended that if a different format is adopted that the content is cross referenced with this template to ensure that everything that we ask for is included.
- A working group involving the school, parents, School Council, governors and representatives of the local community should be established. The group should meet regularly to discuss any issues and implement changes in encouraging sustainable travel.
- To accompany the School Travel Plan we ask that a travel information leaflet is prepared to include relevant walking and cycling maps, public transport and car sharing information. The travel information leaflet should be communicated to parents/pupils/ staff and made available on the school's website/school noticeboard.
