Dear Parents / Carers,

Please can we politely request that you do <u>not</u> let your children play on the pirate ship, trim trail or field <u>before</u> and <u>after</u> school. These are wet and slippery in the morning, therefore dangerous, and children are bringing wet / muddy feet into school. The gates are opened at <u>8:40am</u>, and the bell is rung at <u>8:50am</u>. This only gives children 10 minutes before school; where they need to be fully supervised by parents, please. Children are not permitted to climb the trees at any point during the day at Lawnside.

I wanted to start by sharing with you a brief update on our transition to a primary school, which is happening in September. I would like to reassure you that everything is on track for Lawnside Academy to convert from a lower school, as part of Central Bedfordshire Council's Schools for the Future programme. This is the latest exciting chapter in our school's journey, following our Good Ofsted report last year, and means pupils will stay with us until the end of Year 6 before moving on to secondary school. We are very much looking forward to our expansion and are doing lots of work behind the scenes in preparation; including writing our curriculum ready for our first Year 5 cohort in September and recruiting new teaching staff to join our Lawnside family. Our site will require some new facilities, including additional classroom space, a multi-purpose room and a multi-use games area – we expect CBC to finalise plans and submit these very soon. We look forward to sharing these plans with you and the wider community when they are available.

I have been asked to add a number of polite reminders to this newsletter please:

- 1. Please label all of your children's clothes and belongings our lost property box is overflowing and we are unable to re-unite items with their owners as they are un-named.
- Please refrain from driving up Lawnside before and after-school Central Bedfordshire Council will be trialling a part-time / no entry road closure (between the hours of 7:30am – 9am, and 2:30pm – 4pm) on Lawnside; I will share the details regarding this with you once they have been finalised.
- 3. Please supervise your children on the playground before / after school I have received a number of complaints regarding the behaviour of some children towards other children whilst under parental supervision on the playground.
- 4. Please speak with your children about taking care when exiting the school premises into the alleyway on bikes and scooters after school I have received a complaint from a member of the public who nearly collided with a pupil.

Attendance Guide for Parents / Carers

What YOU must do:

- Try to telephone the school before 8.50am each day of your child's absence.
- Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.
- Please do not book holidays in term-time as these will be unauthorised (and you may be fined), unless in exceptional circumstances.
- If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.
- Have a backup plan for if you have transport issues, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.
- If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!

What WE will do:

- Check your child's attendance every day.
- Phone home to discuss your child's attendance with you.
- Invite you into school for attendance meetings if we are concerned.
- If we cannot establish a reason for absence, then we may make a welfare home visit.

Free School Meals (FSM)

Your child will get a free school meal if you receive a qualifying benefit, and your child is:

- at school
- studying in further education
- at a sixth form college

The qualifying benefits to receive free school meals for children are:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the Guarantee element of State Pension Credit



- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

If you think you meet the free school meals eligibility criteria, please call Central Bedfordshire Council on 0300 300 8306. When you call to apply for free school meals, please have the following information ready:

- National Insurance numbers and dates of birth for you and your partner
- dates of birth for your children
- if you receive support from the National Asylum Support Service, your NASS number


Registering your child as eligible for FSM will bring more money to the school to help your child achieve. There are other benefits which may be available for children registered as eligible for FSM, i.e. help with the cost of music lessons or school trips and free access to CBC's holiday activities and food (HAF) programme.
